What's Title I?

Title I is a government program that gives money to schools so that all children can receive a fair, equal, and high-quality education. Schools receive Title I funds IF at least 47.2% of the students at the school qualify for free or reduced lunch.

Requirements for a Title I School:

- Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA)
 - What is a CNA? A CNA is an analysis the school completes to understand their strengths and challenges and identifies their needs for improvement.
- Title I Schoolwide Plan
 - What is the Title I Schoolwide Plan? Our school writes out a plan every year to outline how we will improve student achievement based on our findings in our CNA.
- Fiscal Requirements Form (FRF)
 - What is an FRF? The Fiscal Requirements Form is an outline of how our school will spend their Title I funds. It is aligned to our CNA and Schoolwide Plan.
- Parent and Family Engagement
 - What does Family Engagement Look Like? Families are always encouraged to be involved in their child's education which improves their performance at school.
